



The mission of **embrace** Western New York is "<u>through education</u>, <u>all things are</u> <u>possible</u>." The **embrace** Western New York **Education Scholarship** provides meaningful support to Western New Yorkers who choose to attend post-secondary education/ training within the region. Applicants may be eligible for a scholarship up to \$2,000. Scholarships will be made available to the recipients after verification of acceptance and enrollment in a recognized post-secondary program. Students may reapply once per academic year.

#### Qualifications:

Scholarships will only be awarded to applicants who are enrolling in post-secondary education at an institution in Western New York (defined as one of the eight western counties of New York State). In addition, applicants must meet at least one of the following criteria:

- > earned high school degree/GED, preferably in Western New York
- ➤ be currently enrolled in a Western New York trade school, certification program, college or university.

The ideal candidate for **embrace** Western New York **Education Scholarship** will be someone who:

- ➤ is passionate about LGBTQ+ issues and/or has a demonstrated commitment to promoting social justice for the LGBTQ+ community (i.e., acceptance and inclusion) in facets of their daily experience (i.e. school, work, church, etc.);
- ➤ has overcome (or is trying to overcome) great obstacles and/or extenuating circumstances in their life directly related to their sexual orientation, gender identity or ally status;
- > and/or has dedicated and/or specialized their craft, experience or expertise to provide valuable specialized services for the local LGBTQ+ and allies community out of a passion for its betterment.

#### **Process:**

- ❖ Interested applicants will complete and return the embrace Western New York Education Scholarship application.
- ❖ There is no deadline for application submission (rolling review process).
- ❖ Applicants will return **completed application** with **two (2) letters of recommendation** (non-family members). Letters of recommendation must contain contact information for the person writing the recommendation. <u>An application will not be considered</u> without letters of recommendation.
- ❖ A copy of the most recent high school, post-secondary school or college transcript must accompany the application.
- ❖ The selection committee will be comprised of the members of Board members of embrace Western New York.
